Lessons learnt

The greatest test is to witness the inability of regulators to embrace scientific truth, and recognise that politicians and bureaucrats are routinely compromised when framing building energy-efficiency regulations, and that Australian Standards have shortcomings by not always demonstrating "net benefit" to the public.

Whom do you most admire?

The few professors and advisory consultants who have forewarned governments in the early phases of regulation formulation for the energy efficiency of buildings. Many of them have been deliberately ignored, sidelined, and not recognised for their experience.

To visit and experience the historic sites which underpin the philosophy of Christianity, which is the underpinning of free liberal Western democracies.

To serve, to strive and not to yield.
